C. Reforming research assessment in light of Open Science? What's the role for research offices?

(Open Science is part of the Horizon Europe's DNA and national strategies for open science are being developed. Open access and open data are just two of a whole set of interlinked processes within Open Science.) To achieve full benefits of open science we have this year been challenged with the need to reform existing systems for research assessment and rewards in academia.

In July this year the final version of the <u>Agreement</u> on reforming research assessment was published, and during the Fall, research institutions all over Europe will consider to sign, followed by an unprecedented process of (collectively?) changing the way we organise quality and impact of research. In this session we will use this as a case to discuss and share what role research support may have in facilitating implementation of the Agreement.
